Itinerary



Thursday 6th October – Trip to the Victorian Goldfields Railway.

This will be a train day, with travel to Castlemaine by regular V/Line service from Southern Cross Station.

There will be a range of travel options;

- Depart from the Tudor by coach at 07:45 and get to Southern Cross Station by 08:45 in time for a V/line departure at 09:05.
- Depart directly from Southern Cross Station. The tour group to assemble at the Bourke Street concourse at the north end of Southern Cross Station.
- Catch the V/Line service from one of the station along the route from Southern Cross to Castlemaine.
- Go directly to Castlemaine station for the start of the steam train trip.

Please select one of these options when filling out the convention registration form. If catching the V/line service from a station other than Southern Cross, then write the name on the registration form.

The tour group will arrive in Castlemaine by regular V/Line service at 10:33.

We have allocated approx. 1 hour for a tour of the Victorian Goldfields Railway facilities at Castlemaine.

The VGR shop will be open for anyone not participating in the tour of facilities, the VGR serve refreshments and sell souvenirs and there is also a display of memorabilia as well.

Our Steam Train will depart Castlemaine at 11:45. If all goes to plan, the train will be hauled by a Victorian Railways J class locomotive, built at the 'Vulcan Foundry' in England.

If anyone should miss the 09:05 V/Line service then the following 10:05 service will get them to Castlemaine before the steam train departs.

This is a charter service for the convention, there will be no members of the general public on the train.

The train will consist of two first class carriages, light snacks will be served and drinks will be available for purchase on the train

There will be a lucky ticket draw for a cab ride for part of the journey, 4 winners will be able to enjoy a ride in the cab;

1. Castlemaine to Muckleford
2. Muckleford to Maldon
3. Maldon to Muckleford
4. Muckleford to Castlemaine.

If a winner is physically unable to ride in the cab or declines, then another person's name will be drawn.

The Steam train arrives Maldon approx. 12:30. – Mini bus transfer to Maldon Township.

We have allowed 2 hours for lunch and sightseeing.

Lunch can be purchased from a range of eateries in the Township, or you can opt to bring a picnic lunch.

Depart Maldon 14:30 (note: this is a charter so the train will wait for stragglers)

Photo stop at Muckleford approx. 45 minutes.

Allowing for any delays' we should get back to Castlemaine in plenty of time for the 16:49 V/line service back to Southern Cross station arriving at 18:32.

Depending on traffic the bus should be back at The Tudor at or before 19:30.
